



We are an official drop off point for The Little Juddies Drought appeal 2018. Non perishable food items can be dropped off to the school office up until **Sept 21st**.





We are a purpose built centre designed to provide the highest possible standard of care and education for children aged 2-6 years. The centre provides care for 29 children a day. Our aim is to provide children with every possible opportunity to help them reach their full potential.

Our service has two homerooms: Lake (2-3years) and Ocean (3-5years). The children will be divided into these rooms according to their age and developmental needs. While the children will be divided into two separate groups, they will be given the opportunity to play as a larger group throughout the day.

At Arcadia Vale Care & Early Education Centre, we believe in the phrase "Play is a Child's Work." Whilst it may appear that the children are "only playing", they are in fact learning valuable skills that will remain with them for the rest of their life. As all activities are based on the children's needs & interests the children are willing participants.

The service consists of a small team of qualified, experienced and caring early childhood educators who are dedicated to providing the highest quality care and education for every child who attends. We all hold formal qualifications in early childhood education, and have experience in working with children aged from birth to 12 years. We all have first aid certificates, attend training courses throughout the year to update our skills and knowledge and have undergone both the Working with Children and Criminal Background Checks.

Free Dental Care for Children




